Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information concerning mobile strength thresholds. Your request was received on 17 May 2022 and we have considered it under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Your request

Requesting the thresholds for each technology generation (2-5G) that Ofcom uses to ascertain if there is sufficient coverage, based on a minimum signal strength

required, to make a 90 second telephone call with a 98% probability successfully, in specific units of measure:

- For 2G in RSSI thresholds for indoor/in-car and outdoor.
- For 3G in RSSI thresholds for indoor/in-car and outdoor.
- For 4G in RSRP thresholds for indoor/in-car and outdoor.
- For 5G in SS RSRP thresholds for indoor/in-car and outdoor.

Our response

We publish our methodology for reporting on mobile coverage in our Connected Nations 2021: Methodology publication. Please refer to the Mobile section beginning with A1.44 on page 11 for the required information. Please note that for 5G, we currently only report on predicted signal thresholds required to indicate a high confidence (80%+) or very high confidence (95%+) of service being available on the ground outdoors.

- the original decision is reversed or modified.

Timing

If you wish to exercise your right to an internal review **you should contact us within two months of the date of this letter.** There is no statutory deadline for responding to internal reviews and it will depend upon the complexity of the case. However, we aim to conclude all such reviews within 20 working days, and up to 40 working days in exceptional cases. We will keep you informed of the progress of any such review. If you are not content with the outcome of the internal review, you have the right to apply directly to the Information Commissioner for a decision.
