## Freedom of Information: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information about the split of D/E in Tech tracker 2022.

We received this request on 19 December 2022 and have considered it under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (“the Act”).

### Your request

You were interested in the raw data that disaggregates socio economic groups D and E for Ofcom’s Tech Tracker 2022. We advised that respondent-level data for the 2022 Technology Tracker is published on our website and can be downloaded from <https://www.ofcom.org.uk/research-and-data/data/statistics/stats22>

On 19 December, you asked: *‘The problem is this has socio economic groups D+E aggregated. Do you have any respondent level data that identifies the exact SEG (D or E)?’*

### Our response

I have investigated your request and can confirm that we do not hold this information in the format you have requested, as all our research has DE combined as standard. However, we have already published the raw data which you may be able to use to create the data split you are after as shown in the attached link.

If you are unhappy with the response you have received in relation to your request for information and/or consider that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law you may ask for an internal review. If you ask us for an internal review of our decision, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom.

The following outcomes are possible:

- the original decision is upheld; or
- the original decision is reversed or modified.

#### **Timing**

If you wish to exercise your right to an internal review **you should contact us within two months of the date of this letter**. There is no statutory deadline for responding to internal reviews and it will depend upon the complexity of the case. However, we aim to conclude all such reviews within 20 working days, and up to 40 working days in exceptional cases. We will keep you informed of the progress of any such review. If you are not content with the outcome of the internal review, you have the right to apply directly to the Information Commissioner for a decision.
