Thank you for your request for information about average broadband contention ratio.

We received this request on 11 November 2024 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOI Act").

Your request

"I am conducting a research on average broadband contention ratio by country, and found that ofcom has issued a report including the average contention ratio in the UK in 2004, which is no longer available on your website. I would appreciate it if you could share it with me along with any more recent reports on the same issue."

Our response

We no longer have a copy of this report and we do not hold any more recent information on average contention ratio in the UK since 2004 as we no longer collect this information. Our work on broadband services does not consider contention ratio specifically, rather we are interested in the effects of contention which lead to service degradation.

Request an internal review

But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
