Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information about enforcement action taken against IX Wireless.

We received this request on 10 May 2024 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOI Act").

Your request and our response

I am writing to request information about enforcement action taken against IX Wireless. In particular, I am writing to inquire into whether enforcement action is being taken against IX Wireless and, if so, what the grounds for this action are (what breaches of planning regulations this action concerns, where these breaches took place and when).

Ofcom currently has no formal investigations into IX Wireless. By way of background, Ofcom has no enforcement powers in respect of planning laws under the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 (GPDO) (as amended) or other related primary or secondary legislation. Ofcom is responsible for enforcement of the Electronic Communications Code (Conditions and Restrictions) Regulations (as amended) ("the Regulations") and, in this role, is in regular contact with local authorities and network providers.

Should such exchanges result in Ofcom opening a formal investigation, it will be announced on Ofcom's <u>website</u>.

Request an internal review

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information, or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
