Thank you for your request for information about Radio Mic Shared Space Licence numbers and enforcement

We received this request on 7 May 2024 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOI Act").

Your request and our response

With regards to UK Wireless Microphone Licences, please can you tell me

[a] How many licences are active at any given point? Let's say 1st July 2023 but if that information is not available then any representative date would do. I'm talking about the 1 year or 2 year shared licences which cost £75 or £135.
