Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information about the legal penalty for unlicensed broadcasting in the UK.

We received this request on 10 April 2024 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Your request & our response

A- What's the current legal penalty as per UK law over seen by ofcom for an unlicensed broadcast in the UK or broadcasting into the UK from outside the UK

Ofcom has published information on <u>illegal broadcasting</u> and the maximum penalties involved from illegal broadcasting within the UK.

However, when it comes to illegal transmissions from another jurisdiction, then the details are passed to the country of concern(s) via internationally agreed processes through the International Telecommunication Union (ITU). The country of origin would have the power to invoke any legal sanctions.

B- what's the penalty by UK law for an unlicensed broadcast in the UK over seen by ofcom for taking advertising revenue from the UK while broadcasting without a license in UK.

Ofcom cannot specifically take action against a station for receiving advertising revenue through illegal broadcasting in the UK, as it does not have the legal remit to do so.
