We received this request on 7 March 2025 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (“the FOI Act”).

“I am contacting you to make a request under the freedom of information act 2005 to obtain the DMR radio frequencies used by Stockton borough council via apex radios I would like to request the frequencies used by the council for the shop watch and CCTV in Stockton high street and also the frequencies used by the civic enforcement team any information you provide will be greatly appreciated I had tried searching ofcoms licence database with no information found I would be grateful for any information you could provide me with thank”

Our response

Details of live business radio licences are published on the Wireless Telegraphy Register, which can be found in Ofcom’s Spectrum Information Portal. Stockton Borough Council do not hold any live Business Radio licences and as such we do not hold the information requested.

Please note that Apex Radio are an equipment supplier, and we would not know whether their radios are supplied to Stockton council, that is a contractual arrangement between both parties

Request an internal review
