Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information concerning historical mobile coverage information.

We received this request on 17 February 2026 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the 'FOI Act').

Your request & our response

I found your connected nations reports and they have been quite useful. I can see that your Mobile Coverage Checker has much more detailed/granular information. I was wondering if you have historical data with more granular information (e.g. postcode or Lsoa) on mobile speed connections that you could share with me?

We have interpreted your request to be asking for mobile speed metrics at postcode or LSOA level. The performance data used in Map Your Mobile (MYM) only goes to postal district level, so we do not hold the data you have requested. In addition, please note that MYM uses a blended Download, Upload and Latency metric, so does not show just "speed" information.

Request an internal review

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information, or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

If you would like to ask us to carry out an internal review, you should get in touch within two months of the date of this letter. There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
