Pact Survey of Distributors

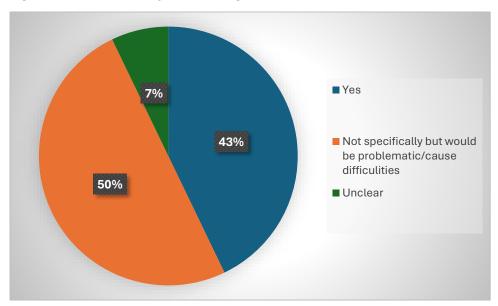
Methodology

Pact surveyed UK distribution companies regarding Ofcom's proposals to amend the Codes of Practice.

The distributors that responded to our survey represent approximately 49% of distribution revenue in the UK.¹

Questions

Question 1. If Ofcom changed the terms of trade to allow PSBs to seek 'matching rights', would it stop you offering finance/advances?



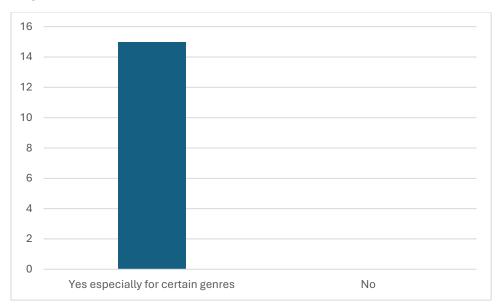
Of the distributors who responded to this survey question²:

- 43% agreed that Ofcom's proposal to change the Terms of Trade to allow the PSBs to seek 'matching rights' would stop them offering finance/advances.
- 50% highlighted that while it may not stop them offering finance/advances, matching rights could cause issues with deals or problems with finance
- 7% of responses were unclear on whether this would stop distributors offering finance/advances

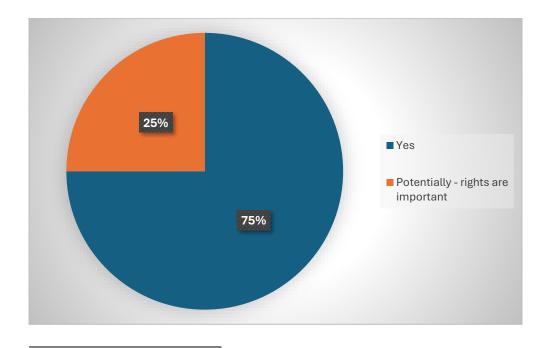
Question 2. Do you agree that PSBs don't fully finance? If so, what genres have the largest deficits?



Of the distributors who responded to this survey question³:

- 100% agreed that the PSBs typically don't fully finance, this was particularly the case for certain genres such as high cost drama.
- Nobody disagreed that the PSBs don't fully finance commissions.

Question 3. Is the ability for producers to raise finance dependent on them being able to exploit those rights in secondary and international markets?

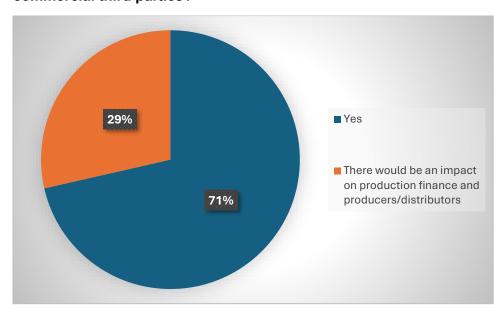

Of the distributors who responded to this survey question⁴:

- 75% said agreed that the ability for producers to raise finance is dependent on them being able to exploit their rights in the secondary and international markets
- 25% highlighted the importance of rights to financing in their response.

Question 4. Do you agree that if the commissioning PSB has the right to acquire additional rights in return for matching any advances/deficits offered by a third party, this will result in de facto exclusivity by the PSBs; effectively shutting out other commercial third parties?



Of the distributors who responded to this survey question⁵:

- 71% agreed that if the commissioning PSB had matching rights this would result in potential exclusivity by the PSBs, shutting out other commercial third parties.
- 29% highlighted that there would be an impact on finance and producers/distributors
