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Reading the proposed changes:

1. "construct and maintain infrastructure on public land (streets) without needing to obtain a specific street works licence to do so": the thought of an Organisation being permitted to carry out works on Public Lands is unacceptable and unbelievable considering the state of "chaos" that exists with Organisation(s), that have to, being able to disrupt the flow of traffic and to disrupt the flow of pedestrian traffic under license. It may be acceptable in the instances of emergency work having to be carried out to restore the services that have been disrupted as a result of natural events and human caused events. Such emergency works must be completed within 72 hours. However, any planned works to update the current infrastructure,

which is, apparently, in good working order, even if not at maximum potential efficiency, should be under the control of a Licensing Authority as exists at present.

2. Must not be able to operate with impunity and must not be subject to preferential treatment that is not available to private individuals or other Organisations.

3. At all times if the Organisation cannot reach an agreement with the Occupier/Owner of Private land, the Organisation must submit an application to an Appropriate Judicial Authority for resolution and in most cases, except where the Occupier/Owner of the Private land is being financially greedy or stubborn, the Applicant must be held liable for the legal costs of the respondent and its own.
