CARP's response to Review of the General Conditions of Entitlement published by Ofcom on 20 December 2016

We refer to Section C3 "Public pay telephones" of Annex 12 to the Review of the General Conditions of Entitlement published by Ofcom on 20 December 2016. We wish to add the following additional conditions:

- (e) All text must be displayed in type large enough to be read easily by a partially-sighted person to comply with the Equality Act 2010.
- (f) The background to the text must be white and there must be a good contrast between the colour of the text and the background.
- (g) As well as displaying the minimum charge payable for connection of a call, the notice must also display a comparison between the cost of a call to a landline and the cost of a call to a mobile phone. This information is necessary for openness because BT currently charges nearly 100 times as much for the latter.
