Proposed new obligations:

At least hourly during daytime weekdays and peaktime at weekends. At other times UK-wide, nations and international news should feature.

The holder of an analogue local commercial radio licence may apply to Ofcom to have the station's Format amended. Any application should be made using the layout shown on this form, and should be in accordance with Ofcom's published procedures for Format changes.¹

Under section 106(1A) of the Broadcasting Act 1990 (as amended), Ofcom may consent to a change of a Format only if it is satisfied that *at least* one of the following five statutory criteria is satisfied:

- (a) that the departure would not substantially alter the character of the service;
- (b) that the departure would not narrow the range of programmes available by way of relevant independent radio services to persons living the area or locality for which the service is licensed to be provided;
- (c) that the departure would be conducive to the maintenance or promotion of fair and effective competition
- (d) that there is evidence that, amongst persons living in that area or locality, there is a significant demand for, or significant support for, the change that would result from the departure; or
- (e) that (i) the departure would result from programmes included in the licensed service ceasing to be made at premises in the area or locality for which the service is provided, but (ii) those programmes would continue to be made wholly or partly at premises within the approved area (as defined in section 314 of the Communications Act 2003 (local content and character of services)).

Only one of these five criteria need be satisfied in order for Ofcom to consent to the proposed change. However, even if Ofcom is of the opinion that the proposed change satisfies one or more of the statutory criteria, there may be reasons (depending on the particular circumstances of the case) why Ofcom may not consent to the proposed change. The additional criteria to which Ofcom will have regard when exercising this discretion can be found on our website.²

Applicants should note that, under section 106ZA of the same Act (as amended), a proposed change that *does not* satisfy the first or last of these criteria (i.e. a change that Ofcom considers would or could substantially alter the character of the service, or does not relate to the origin of locally-made programmes) must, if it is to be considered further under any of the other three criteria, be consulted upon.

In the event that Ofcom receives a request for Format change and considers that criterion (a) or (e) is *not* satisfied, it will seek confirmation from the applicant as to whether it wishes to proceed with the request (and, if so, whether it wishes to amend or replace its submission in light of the necessity to make it public).#

The changes would not substantially alter the character service. The programming with still be coming from the North East region of the UK.

Change is in line with the deregulation of local radio as set out by Ofcom in October 2018. In addition to this, the stations are not financially sustainable as standalone entities.

Ofcom notes on the request

Statutory requirements

This request relates to the FM licence for Darlington held by Imagine FM Limited ('Imagine FM'), currently broadcasting as 'Alpha Radio'.

Every FM local commercial radio service is required to broadcast a certain amount of locally-made programming, which is specified in its Format. Locally-made programmes are those made within a station's licensed area or, where Ofcom has approved a wider area relating to that station, that 'approved area.'

Imagine FM has requested the following changes to the Format of the Darlington licence:

- To produce locally-made programming hours anywhere within the Ofcom approved area of the North East of England.
- To share all local programming hours with the Durham and Sunderland licences.

These proposed changes would change the character of service as set out in the Format of the licence, and accordingly can be agreed only if Ofcom is satisfied in regard to one of the statutory criteria set out in section 106(1A) of the Broadcasting Act 1990 (as set out in the request, above).

If we are satisfied in relation to one of the statutory criteria, we are then able to decide whether or not to approve the request, taking account of our published policy criteria.

Assessment

With regard to the request to broadcast locally-made programming hours from anywhere within the approved area of the North East of England, Ofcom was satisfied in relation to section 106(1A)(e) of the Broadcasting Act 1990, on the basis that the change requested, if approved, would result in programmes included in the licensed service being made at premises within the North East of England approved area.

We were also satisfied in relation to section 106(1A)(a) with regard to the request to share all local programming hours with the Durham and Sunderland licences. This request is consistent with our <u>localness guidelines</u>, and we would continue to expect the licensee to provide a local service that includes sufficient local material to deliver the required character of service.

As a matter of general policy, we are content to approve Format change requests relating to locally-made programming and programme sharing where all the stations involved are located within the same approved area, provided we are satisfied that the stations involved will continue to meet their licence obligations to provide local material relevant to the listeners in their individual licence areas.

Decision

Ofcom decided to approve this Format change request from Imagine FM because we were satisfied in relation to two of the relevant statutory criteria, and for the policy reason outlined above.
