EAVA FM's award-winning output over the years has been eclectic, including music, local news and information with cultural, faith and educational programming, all supported by community members and local stakeholders. — the proposed changes are about ensuring our volunteers' creativity isn't restricted.

They are the key driver for these changes. They want to ensure that EAVA FM is able to broadcast

#### Ofcom Notes on the Request

The request was AGREED, because Ofcom was satisfied in relation to Section 106(1A)(a) of the Broadcasting Act 1990 (as modified by the Community Radio Order 2004, and further modified by the Community Radio (Amendment) Orders 2010 and 2015) i.e. that the change would not substantially alter the character of the service, and for the policy reasons given below.

The Licensee is requested to convert its Key Commitments for original output and locally produced output from daily to weekly requirements, which will reduce its requirement from 10 hours per day (70 hours per week equivalent) and 13 hours per day (91 hours per week equivalent) to 56 hours per week and 70 hours per week respectively. These represent reductions of 20% and 30% respectively. In requesting these changes the Licensee has stated that the proposal will enable it to have additional flexibility to deliver the licenced service. We are satisfied these changes do not substantially alter the character of service.

In terms of our policy criteria, Ofcom is satisfied the change will not affect the station's ability to meet the community radio 'characteristics of service' set out in the legislation, and there are no other policy reasons to refuse the change. We have therefore decided to exercise our discretion to approve this change.
