Volunteer availability fluctuations and public transport limitations, sometimes hinder our ability to fulfil key commitments with required hours. To counter this, we're piloting a solution: allowing some presenters to produce shows from home. We ensure their content remains regionally relevant and this approach helps us maintain local content while addressing volunteer challenges and cost concerns.

Ofcom notes on the request

The request was AGREED, because Ofcom was satisfied in relation to Section 106 (1A)(a) of the Broadcasting Act 1990 (as modified by the Community Radio Order 2004, and further modified by the Community Radio (Amendment) Orders 2010 and 2015) i.e. that the change would not substantially alter the character of the service, and for the policy reasons given below.

The Licensee is requesting to convert its Key Commitment for locally produced output from a daily to weekly requirement, but also to reduce it from 24 hours per day (168 hours per week equivalent) to 129 hours per week. The Licensee is requesting this change in order to give it more flexibility to deal with fluctuations in volunteer availability and public transport limitations, stating that making this change will allow volunteers to broadcast content produced from their homes outside the licence area.

While this is a relatively large reduction in the amount of locally produced content required each week of approximately 30%, we believe that 129 hours per week remains a relatively high commitment, and one that will ensure the Licensee continues to deliver an appropriate amount of locally produced output. We agree with the Licensee's assertion that content produced from volunteers at home could still be relevant to its target community as part of a varied schedule, noting that a sizeable amount of content must still be produced from within the licensed coverage area.

We have considered this request under our policy criteria and consider that there are no policy reasons to refuse this request. We are satisfied that the change will not prevent the Licensee from providing a service for the people of Witney and outlying areas in West Oxfordshire, and that the change will not reduce the social gain delivered to that community. We have therefore decided to exercise our discretion to approve the change.
