The purpose of this form

You should complete this form if you are applying for a Community Digital Sound Programme (C-DSP) licence.

A digital sound programme service intended for broadcast by means of a local or small-scale radio multiplex service requires either a C-DSP licence or a local DSP licence. Ofcom's published guidance notes set out some of the key issues that potential applicants need to consider in deciding which type of licence is suitable for them. In summary, C-DSP services are not run for financial gain and are required to provide social gain. C-DSP licences therefore include strict conditions to ensure that happens, and provide less flexibility than a local DSP licence. However, they do provide access to capacity that small-scale radio multiplex service providers are required to reserve solely for C-DSP services.

A C-DSP licence will be required even if the same programme service is also provided on any other platforms (e.g. FM, satellite), as separate licences are required for those.

As noted above, small-scale radio multiplex services will have reserved capacity for C-DSP services. Issue of a C-DSP licence does not, however, guarantee carriage on a small-scale (or local) radio multiplex service. That is a matter for agreement between the C-DSP licensee and the multiplex service provider, and there may be more C-DSP licences issued in a locality than there are reserved slots on the small-scale radio multiplex service. Note that a C-DSP service does not necessarily have to broadcast using reserved capacity. It can use unreserved capacity on a small-scale radio multiplex service or capacity on a local radio multiplex service, again subject to agreement with the multiplex service provider.

An application for a C-DSP licence will be accepted only once Ofcom has advertised the licence for the small-scale radio multiplex service upon which the proposed C-DSP service is intended to be provided. There is no closing-date by which an application for a C-DSP licence must be submitted (i.e. it can be submitted at any time after the licence for the relevant small-scale radio multiplex licence has been advertised).

On 1 July 2024, Quality Radio Enterprise Ltd., received an email from Ofcom Broadcast Licensing Team advising of a complaint about Quality Radio. We duly responded timeously to the requested questions and other documents.

On 23 July 2024, we receive email correspondence from Ofcom Broadcast Licensing stating: "We have decided not to open an investigation into Quality Radio's compliance with regards to the above requirements of its Key Commitments at this time and will not be pursuing this complaint any further."

Quality Radio is for all the people of Paisley and surrounding areas in Renfrewshire. The service provides a voice and a community resource through entertainment, local news, discussion, and the expression of opinion. The service has a local focus with people from all communities and all ages involved in its operation.

3.6 How will you ensure that your proposed C-DSP service is run on a not-for-profit basis? Everyone, including directors, are volunteers with the social enterprise.

Any surplus from income activities and grant awards, are solely used to improve the social gain objectives. The company Articles of Association are the instrument to ensure the community enterprise is run on a not-for-profit basis. There are no shareholders.

Social gain

3.7 What community benefits will your service bring to your target community(ies) and, if applicable, the general public. The community benefits include improving the general level of health and wellbeing in the local Paisley and Renfrewshire community, particularly the older generation by providing information and advice from our charity partners, which include ROAR – Connections for Life; Renfrewshire Citizens Advice Bureau, RAMH – Recovery Across Mental Health, Renfrewshire Anti Stigma Alliance (RASA) and Legal Matters advice from a Paisley solicitor and Renfrewshire CAB.

Quality Radio has established the **Quality Wellbeing Hub**. This includes advice and information from NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde nursing staff on Healthy Minds Matter to include on-air surgeries from a nurse at a Renfrewshire Health Centre and Surgery.

Also, the **Quality Wellbeing Hub** programmes, broadcast on two days per week, include features on Health Matters, Healthy Minds Matters; Fitness Matters and Empower – recovery from eating disorders.

Apart from on-air 'surgeries' Quality Radio is moving forward with the **Quality Wellbeing Hub** in the community throughout Renfrewshire, with support from Renfrewshire Council Social Work and Renfrewshire Health and Social Care Partnership, Love Street, Paisley.

Quality Radio is an active founder member of Renfrewshire Anti Stigma Alliance (RASA), Love Street, Paisley. **RASA** is an alliance of statutory, voluntary and community groups who have come together to influence and strengthen community action by empowering communities to end mental health stigma and discrimination and promote community health and wellbeing.

Activities include tackling stigma in Renfrewshire in a proactive, meaningful and collaborative way. This includes live engagement with those attending and broadcast on Quality Radio onair.

Quality Radio is expanding the programmes for hospital patient requests. In June 2025, volunteer presenter/producer Hugh Lindsay received an award from the National Association of Hospital Broadcasting Services for his involvement with patients and staff at the Royal Alexandra Hospital, Paisley, for the weekly patient's choice request programme, plus involvement with the Quality Wellbeing Hub. As part of this activity, includes entertainment at residential homes operated by Renfrewshire Council Social Care Partnership at: Darkwood Court, Paisley; Speirsfield Gardens, Paisley; Springbank Complex, Paisley and Monkdyke House, Renfrew.

Quality Radio volunteers were invited to a Civic Reception by Glasgow City Council to acknowledge their contributions to NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde, which serves Paisley and Renfrewshire, during Volunteers Week 2025 There is also a weekly music request programme specially for Sheltered Housing residents across Paisley and Renfrewshire at: Altpatrick Gardens, Paisley; Houston Court, Johnstone; The Oaks Complex, Johnstone; Darkwood Court, Paisley; Gallacher Court, Paisley; Speirsfield Gardens, Paisley; Springbank Complex, Paisley; Fulbar Court, Renfrew and Monkdyke House, Renfrew.

Quality Radio will facilitate discussion and expression of opinion through a range programme features and topics to include health discussions and information from experienced health and wellbeing professionals.

There will be an opportunity for discussion and opinion through the Renfrewshire Citizens Advice Bureau based in Paisley. This is a regular on-air feature with the local Renfrewshire Citizens Advice Bureau specialist.

There will be a weekly Health Matters discussion with a Health Centre Practice Nurse, Healthy Minds Matter feature with a recognised wellbeing professional. NHS News features provide latest information on a wide range of subjects from NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde Health Board

Listeners are invited to make contact with Quality Radio to answer questions and provide advice for this and the other organisations that we support. Also, they are invited to choose the music that they wish to hear. Quality Radio receives around 250 suggestions of music choices per month from listeners.

There will be discussions and opinions on football team performance, reports, and results to include St Mirren FC who play in the SPL plus Johnstone Burgh FC who won the Scottish Junior Cup 2025 plus other clubs: Renfrew FC, Arthurlie FC and other sports.

3.9 How will you ensure that members of your target community(ies) can gain access to the facilities used to provide your service, and receive training in using these? In particular, please set out how this will be done practically, formally, and/or informally. **Answer in fewer than 400 words**.

The target community can gain access to the studio facilities at 7 Glasgow Road, Paisley.

Volunteering is open to all ages. All new volunteers will be supported one-to-one to provide technical assistance and practical assistance to help them achieve their goals from volunteering. Individual training is set at 50 hours for each new volunteers in the first year, and more advanced training is available to existing volunteers as they need it. Quality Radio facilities include the latest version of Myriad6 Cloud operating playout system.

We provide training in our dedicated studio at 7 Glasgow Road Paisley for school pupils, university students and adult learning groups with a 13-week course on radio broadcasting based on SQA level 5.



In addition, there will be a good proportion of content from our correspondents at local football clubs in Paisley, Renfrew, Johnstone and Barrhead.

All volunteers are provided with Compliance Procedures documents during induction when joining the service.

All station volunteers receive basic induction training in safety, expected behaviour and studio etiquette when they initially join the service – this includes Ofcom Broadcast Codes compliance information to ensure that they have an awareness of requirements, regardless of the role they eventually take on within the station.

Volunteers will receive training in checking music for broadcast and have access to our approved data base on Myriad6 Cloud.

At quarterly presenter/producer 1-2-1s the compliance of the Broadcasting Code is included in adherence.
