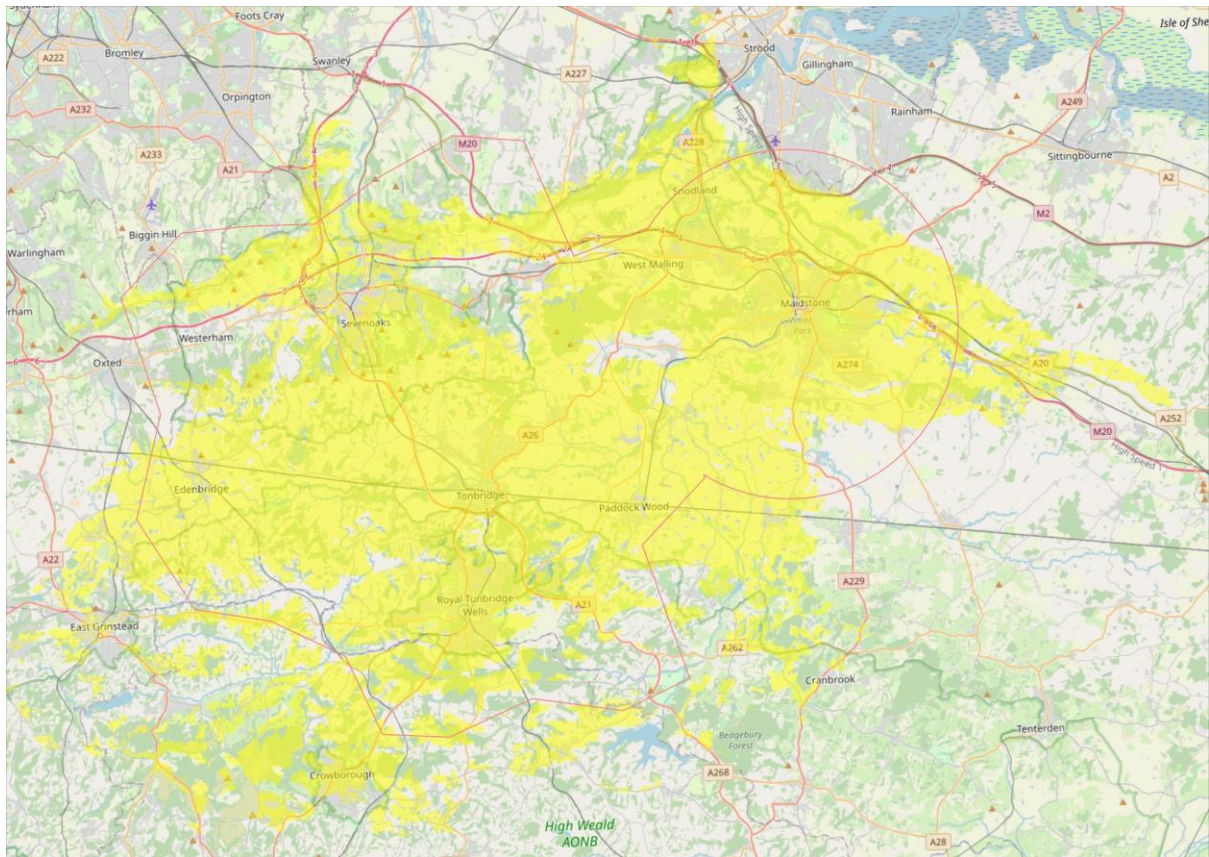

## **Financial and business plan**

3.17 *Please provide a high-level estimate of the costs you believe will be required to establish the multiplex service.*

Our aim is to establish a successful small scale multiplex operation, providing community and commercial broadcasters, established and new, with a reliable digital broadcast platform on both affordable and flexible terms.

The board and shareholders have, between them, extensive experience in community radio, local radio and digital radio and particular experience in making new small and medium sized radio projects work.

### **Low Cost Carriage**

Our core ambition is to offer service providers a low cost, easy to access, high quality digital broadcast platform and to ensure its long-term sustainability. To achieve this, we will offer reserved capacity to C-DSP licence holders at a discount to the equivalent rate of unreserved capacity. Carriage fees will be invoiced monthly in advance and increase annually by RPI.

Each service provider will be provided with similar carriage contracts, with identical terms and conditions. All will be offered contracts that run to the end of the multiplex licences. We recognise that some service providers may wish to contract for shorter periods, and will accommodate such requests. We believe that our chosen tariff structure provides certainty to service providers over their carriage costs throughout the contract and / or licence term.

### **Promoting the Opportunity**

As well as direct communication, we have promoted the multiplex opportunity via social media and news releases in industry and local press.

### **Service Providers**

The number of confirmed services gives us confidence in the financial stability of our plans to launch and sustain the multiplex. Several of the proposed service providers have worked with the shareholders before or have a positive experience on existing small-scale DAB trials and / or local multiplexes.

### **Objectives**

We have signed Heads of Terms for 15 services. Under our operating model, Kent Capacity Co has agreed to underwrite capacity fees to ensure the multiplex runs cash positive.

### **Commitment**

The shareholders have come together with a shared long term commitment to DAB broadcasting, and are committed to investing in the platform to keep abreast of technical developments during the licence term.

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### Establishment and Running Costs

We anticipate the majority of costs to be related to the build of our transmission site - £54,000. Legal and other administrative costs in pre-launch period are assumed at £6,000 and we have included a 12.5% contingency.

### Funding

The company will be funded through a combination of equity and primarily shareholder working capital loans. The shareholders have confirmed their ability to cover this funding.

West Kent DAB Ltd is a strong applicant group with collaboration at the heart of its ethos. It brings together three partners, each making a unique contribution by way of relevant skills and knowledge:

- **West Kent Radio** is a community based and focused radio station providing local news and information to Tonbridge, Southborough, Tunbridge Wells, Paddock Wood, Sevenoaks and surrounding villages. It is a charity radio station, staffed entirely by local volunteers, both promoting and reflecting the local environment, whilst providing the best entertainment.
- **MuxCom** has been created as a dedicated platform for investing in and actively participating in small-scale DAB, with a primary focus on West Kent.
- **Kent Capacity Co** is a collaboration of Kent experienced broadcasters and digital radio multiplex managers. It will market opportunities to broadcast across Kent's small scale DAB multiplexes, sell spare capacity on the multiplex and identify new revenue streams on behalf of West Kent DAB. In addition to representing revenue for the multiplex, KCC will also operate its own service 'Kent!' providing a wide mix of adult music and local what's on information for a great day out in Kent.

Their combined experience as service providers and multiplex operators gives us an excellent understanding of what is required – good coverage, service reliability and easy access for programme providers at an affordable and realistic price.



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### **Multiplex Management**

West Kent DAB has entered into a multiplex management agreement with MuxNet UK, who will oversee the build of the multiplex and transmitter network, contracts with service providers, liaison with Ofcom and service providers and oversee day to day multiplex management and service provider liaison ongoing. MuxNet has substantial digital radio experience in terms of both multiplex build and operation, as well as digital radio services.

MuxNet UK has considerable experience in launching, establishing and maintaining local and small-scale DAB multiplexes, being involved in the Bristol and South Birmingham small-scale multiplexes. They have the required technical competence, operational expertise, financial knowledge and aptitude to manage third party relationships successfully.

Multiplex management involves supporting, maintaining and upgrading the multiplex system hardware & software; promoting the multiplex; contracting services to ensure that the multiplex is always full; invoice management and payment collection; and working with programme services to ensure DSPS and regulatory licence compliance.

MuxNet UK will be responsible for the launch of the multiplex and its subsequent day to day operation; in particular:

- Overseeing bit rate variations, enhancements or projects required by service providers, such as EPG provision, temporary services and data developments.
- Working with service providers and the transmission subcontractor to maximise multiplex functionality and efficiency.
- Monitoring and fault reporting, ensuring that the output of all service providers is correctly logged and compliant with legislation and codes.
- Developing new revenue streams.

MuxNet UK will oversee any multiplex re-configurations and these will be undertaken in line with our policies and contractual agreements with service providers.

### **Key Personnel**

**Andrew Yeates** began his broadcast career over 40 years ago at 2UW Sydney, gaining experience in presentation, production, sales and administration. He moved to Europe in the early 1990s as media consultant concentrating on the emerging broadcasting markets of central and Eastern Europe, with clients including DMG Radio, Crown Communications, RFM France and ZET Poland. More recently, Andrew has been station manager at ATLANTIS Radio, a commercial radio service with a pure 60s format and 1AU Classic Hits, a music service available on DAB. Andrew brings his expertise and knowledge to the applicant, and holds a deep passion for the opportunities that small-scale DAB offers the local community.

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**The MuxNet UK team** - Gregory Watson, Nick Piggott and Matt Deegan, have been involved in DAB broadcasting since 1999 and the launch of Digital One and the subsequent development of the Now Digital Network.

Since 2008, Gregory Watson and Matt Deegan, along with colleague Nicky Tate, have successfully built the MuxCo, working with local shareholders to ensure that all broadcasters have opportunities to participate in DAB. Gregory has deep experience of regulatory and business affairs, whilst Matt has been involved with strategic and commercial development of digital radio for many years, and leads on commercial opportunities.

Nick Piggott has extensive experience in digital radio technology. He has been deeply involved with Small Scale DAB trials in several locations, as well as the Open Digital Radio project, and has decades of technical experience of Digital Radio, sitting on the Technical Committee of WorldDAB and contributing to the creation of technical standards and guidance papers.

We intend to launch the Maidstone, Tonbridge & Tunbridge Wells small-scale DAB multiplex within 10 months of approval of our technical plan.

Upon award, we will immediately advance negotiations regarding the proposed transmission sites and liaise with other radio multiplex licensees on any impact our proposed transmitters might have. Once completed, we will seek agreement from Ofcom for the proposed technical plan – mindful that the coverage proposed in our application is an award criterion and that any change will need to deliver broadly equivalent coverage.

We will send final site details to Ofcom for clearance and provide evidence of liaison and agreement with other radio multiplex licensees. Given the time taken to co-ordinate services we recognise the importance getting the final transmitter plans to Ofcom as quickly as possible.

Our timeline then focuses on the following key stages:

- Building and installing the DAB multiplex and transmission chain
- Finalising carriage agreements with the service providers
- Commissioning and testing the transmitter equipment for compliance with Ofcom's Digital Radio Technical Code
- Providing Ofcom with evidence of compliance with the licence and the Digital Radio Technical Code

We have confirmed the availability of all equipment and professional services to meet our timescales.

We will continue to promote opportunities on the multiplex to broaden the range of formats and suppliers on the multiplex.

If successful, we commit to work with all community radio providers based within the licence area and who wish to broadcast on the multiplex.
